

Air ducts and cable trays

Regulatory Compliance: Cable trays are governed by electrical codes (e.g., NEC Article 392) and have specific limitations on where they can be installed, while air ducts follow HVAC standards and building codes (Cable Trays.org) .

Interaction in Buildings While air ducts and cable trays may coexist in the same building, they are distinct systems. Large air ducts typically take routing priority due to their rigidity, and cable trays are designed to bend around them. Shared support structures are possible but must account for the combined weight and safety requirements (Apex Tray) .
