

Application of Optical Cable Removal Quota Items

Optical cable removal quota items are applied to ensure precise, standardized removal of cable sheaths and coatings for termination, splicing, and maintenance, minimizing fiber damage and material waste.

Purpose and Scope The application of optical cable removal quota items involves controlled removal of cable sheaths, jackets, and coatings to prepare fibers for termination or splicing. This ensures that the fiber maintains its optical performance, mechanical integrity, and compliance with organizational or industry standards, such as MIL-STD-975, NASA NSPL, or ITU-T L.25 recommendations.

Key Steps in Cable Removal Preparation and Tool Verification All tools and materials must be checked for proper calibration, cleanliness, and approval for use. This includes sheath knives, strippers, scissors, and polishing tools. Equipment and material lot numbers are recorded for traceability.

Sheath and Jacket Removal For loose tube cables, the outer PVC sheath is marked and “ringed” at the designated removal length, typically 2 meters (6 feet) for end access unless local practices specify otherwise. The outer sheath is carefully cut or shaved along the marked section to avoid damaging underlying buffer tubes. For high fiber count cables, multiple layers of buffer tubes may require sequential removal to expose the inner fibers.

Fiber Coating Stripping The protective acrylate coating is removed using chemical or mechanical stripping, with chemical stripping preferred to reduce the risk of nicks or latent defects. Only approved cleaning agents should be used to prevent coating delamination or fiber weakening.

Mid-Span Access and Slack Management When accessing cables mid-span, slack loops of approximately 244 cm (96 inches) are left to facilitate routing and storage within closures. Tape markers are placed along the cable to guide precise removal and separation of the sheath.
