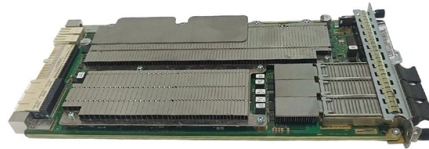


Are network server racks harmful
