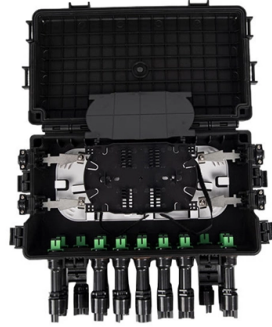

Burundi is subdivided into provinces, communes and collines, in contrast to the United States, which is divided into states and counties. Provinces were first set up by the Belgian Colonial Administration in 1960, to replace traditional chieftains. Until 2025, there were 18 provinces in Burundi, each named after their provincial capital.
