 - Tees and Crosses:** For branching cable runs.
 - Covers and Clips:** For protection and securing cables.
 - Joint Connectors:** For connecting straight sections.

Vertical trays can be mounted to walls, floors, ceilings, or equipment racks. Modular design allows easy configuration for new or existing cable routes. Ensure compliance with voltage, current, and temperature ratings specified by the manufacturer.
