Overview

Have you ever walked on the street and noticed the fiber cables hanging on poles overhead?

These cables are called aerial fiber cables and are commonly used for outside plant (OSP) installation on poles. Aerial installation is generally much less costly than underground construction also. Fiber in a duct solutions have a major aesthetic. Cables on poles sharing electrical and telecom/CATV cables must be installed in the telecom space with proper clearance from both electrical cables and other low voltage cables. That makes it quicker to deploy and easier to inspect, but the cable must withstand wind, ice, UV exposure, vibration and occasional mechanical abuse. Unlike other common fiber optic cables, this kind of optical cable is designed to adjust to the harsh outdoor environments for aerial installments.
