Tie spacing: The NEC does not specify exact distances between ties, but practical spacing depends on cable type, diameter, and weight. For example, MI cables with fire-resistant ratings should be tied every three feet using stainless steel ties.

Cable drops to equipment: Anchor cables to the last one to three rungs before the drop to provide distributed support for lengths over six feet.

Types of Cable Ties

- Standard nylon ties:** Suitable for general cable management in most trays.
- Stainless steel ties:** Recommended for heavy-duty or fire-rated cables, or where high mechanical strength is required.
- Serrated fixing ties:** Designed for direct attachment to cable trays using pre-drilled holes, providing secure and easy installation.

Best Practices

- Use ties that are compatible with the cable type and tray material.
- Avoid over-tightening, which can damage cable insulation.
- Consider permanent barriers or separate trays for sensitive signal cables to maintain separation from power cables.
- Ensure all ties are rated for the environmental conditions, such as temperature, UV exposure, or chemical resistance.

Cables may be fastened to the cable tray by means of cable clamps or cable ties (See Figures 5.7 and 5.8). Generally, cables are fastened every 450 mm (18 in.) on vertical runs.
