This occurs because Revit calculates the tag based on the original orientation of the tray. Level Reference Conflicts: BOT elevation tags are often tied to project levels. If the cable tray's reference level does not match the architectural or structural level, the BOT elevation may appear incorrect. Adjusting the reference level or using a calculated offset can resolve this. Offset Adjustments: In cases where multiple levels are not feasible, a calculated value can be applied to the BOT tag to reflect the correct elevation relative to the finished floor or room elevation. Methods to Correct or Display BOT Elevation Insert Bottom Elevation Labels: Software like Design Master allows you to insert a BOT elevation label directly on the tray, specifying the section and location of the label for clarity. Adjust Reference Levels: Change the cable tray's reference level in the properties to match the desired floor or structural level, ensuring the BOT elevation tag reflects the correct height. Model Orientation: If using Revit, model the tray in the intended orientation (vertical or horizontal) from the start to avoid discrepancies between width, height, and BOT elevation. Calculated Offsets: Introduce a user-defined delta in the tag to adjust the...
