Ensure all supports are strong enough to handle the cable weight with a safety margin of at least 25%.

Installing Cables Measure and Cut: Cut cables to the required length and deburr any sharp edges to prevent insulation damage.

Lay Cables in Trays: Place cables neatly in the tray, avoiding excessive bending. Maintain organized spacing to reduce heat buildup and allow airflow.

Secure Cables: Use hold-down clips, cable ties, or straps at regular intervals to prevent movement. Follow design standards for spacing and ensure the tray is not overfilled (typically max 40–50% of tray capacity) to avoid overheating.

Labeling: Mark cables for identification to facilitate maintenance and troubleshooting.

Joining and Adjustments When connecting tray sections, use splice plates or couplers to join ends securely. For bends, tees, or elevation changes, use appropriate fittings and ensure cables are supported throughout the transition. Check that all trays are level and aligned to prevent cable stress.
