

Can a wired router connection use fiber optic cable

This setup ensures that your router can handle the high speeds and low latency of fiber internet while maintaining compatibility with standard networking equipment.

Using Existing Routers You can often use your existing wired router with fiber internet as long as it has a WAN Ethernet port capable of handling the speeds provided by your fiber service. However, the router's performance may limit the maximum speed achievable, so for full fiber performance, a fiber-ready or gigabit-capable router is recommended.

Direct Fiber-Compatible Routers Some modern routers come with built-in SFP ports or are labeled as fiber-ready or GPON-compatible, allowing them to connect directly to fiber without an ONT. These are less common in residential setu...
