

Can an electrical distribution box be placed inside an elevator

Panels should not be installed in pits, hoistways, or other areas where personnel may be exposed to moving elevator components . GFCI and Receptacle Requirements: Any receptacles in elevator pits, hoistways, or machinery spaces must be GFCI-protected if rated 15A or 20A, 125V, to ensure safety for maintenance personnel . This applies to receptacles, not necessarily the distribution box itself, but any branch circuits serving the elevator must follow these rules. Mounting and Clearance: Panels must be firmly secured and have dedicated space from floor to 6 feet (1.8 m) for safe operation. Equipment should not extend more than 6 inches beyond the panel front, and the workspace must remain clear of storage or obstructions . The top of the panelboard should not exceed 6 feet 7 inches (2 meters) above the floor for safe access . Wiring Methods: Conductors in elevator machine rooms or control spaces must be installed in rigid metal conduit,...
