

Cisco switch optical port speed settings



AI Overview

Cisco optical ports (SFP/SFP+/QSFP) typically operate at fixed speeds and full-duplex, but can be monitored and configured via CLI or web interface if supported.

Default Behavior of Optical Ports

Most Cisco fiber-optic ports, such as 100BASE-FX, 1G SFP, or 10G SFP+, operate at a preset speed and are always full-duplex. Unlike copper ports, they do not require manual duplex configuration, and auto-negotiation is often unnecessary or limited to certain SFP types. This ensures stable connectivity and avoids mismatched settings that can occur on copper ports.

Checking Port Speed

You can verify the speed of an optical port using the CLI:

```
CodeCopyshow interface
```

For example, `show interface Gi1/0/1` displays the current speed, duplex mode, and media type. To check a specific port's speed only, you can filter the output:

```
CodeCopyshow interface Gi1/0/1 | include Mb/s
```

This command confirms the operational speed without requiring a switch reboot.

Configuring Port Speed

While most optical ports are fixed-speed, some modular SFP+ or combo ports allow manual configuration. Steps via CLI include:

- Enter privileged EXEC mode:
- CodeCopyenable
- Enter global configuration mode:
- CodeCopyconfigure
- terminal
- Select the interface:
- CodeCopyinterface TenGigabitEthernet1/1/1
- Set speed and duplex (if supported):
- CodeCopyspeed 10000duplex full
- Exit configuration mode and save:
- CodeCopyendwrite memory

For copper ports, speed can be set to 10, 100, 1000, or multigigabit (2.5/5 Gbps) depending on the hardware. Optical ports usually only support the speed corresponding to the SFP module installed.

Web-Based Configuration

On Cisco Small Business switches, optical port settings can also be managed via the web-based utility:

- Log in to the switch web interface.
- Navigate to Port Management > Port Settings.
- Select the optical port and click Edit.
- Review or adjust advertised capabilities, speed, and duplex if available.
- Apply changes and save the running configuration to startup.

Small Form-factor Pluggable

Unlike most non-SFP, copper 1000BASE-T ports integrated into most routers and switches, 1000BASE-T SFPs usually cannot operate at 100BASE-TX speeds.
