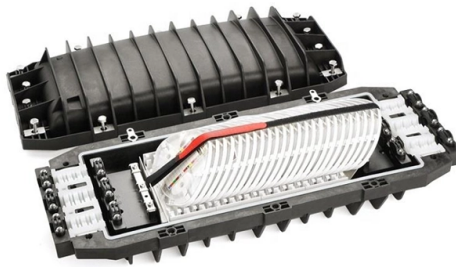


Core switch with firewall



AI Overview

- Performance Impact:** Integrating firewall functions into a core switch may introduce latency if the switch is handling high volumes of traffic, especially with deep packet inspection or advanced security features.
- Scalability:** Core switches with built-in firewalls must be sized appropriately to handle both switching and security workloads without bottlenecks.

Advanced Features: Modern firewalls, including next-generation firewalls (NGFWs), can provide additional capabilities such as intrusion detection, application control, and URL filtering, which can be leveraged if supported by the core switch.

Conclusion A core switch with a firewall enhances network security by combining central traffic management with robust access control, but careful planning is required to balance performance and security. This approach is particularly useful in environments where a layered security strategy is needed to protect critical internal networks from external threats.
