Overview

The Instituto Costarricense de Electricidad (ICE), through its commercial brand, kölbi, has announced the integration of the next-generation TAM-1 submarine cable, a strategic infrastructure project that will expand the country's international connectivity capacity 23-fold. The upgrade is expected to boost the country's bandwidth by 23 times. This 7,000-kilometer cable, stretching from the United States down the Atlantic coast to Limón, Costa Rica — LIMÓN, Costa Rica - A new era of digital connectivity dawned on Costa Rica's Caribbean coast this week as the state-owned Instituto Costarricense de Electricidad (ICE) officially welcomed the landing of the TAM-1 submarine fiber optic cable.
