

Distance between cable trays and combustible gases



Overview

This design note adopts a 300 mm horizontal air-gap separation between primary and secondary life-safety trays on roofs, based on these regulatory requirements and established UK guidance. BS 7671:2018 +A2:2022 states: “Circuits of safety services shall be independent of other.
