Safety and Design Considerations Ensure the tertiary box is rated for the load it will serve and matches the voltage and phase supplied by the secondary box. Maintain proper protection devices such as residual current devices (RCDs) and circuit breakers at both secondary and tertiary levels. Follow the principle of one machine, one switch, one RCD, one box to avoid overloading and ensure safe operation (). Use rainproof and durable enclosures if the boxes are installed outdoors.
