Physical Connections Connect the selected ports between the two switches. For MLAG, designate one switch as Top and the other as Bottom to maintain consistent configuration. If possible, run cables over different physical paths to reduce the risk of simultaneous link failure. 3. Configure the Aggregation UniFi Switches (LACP): Log in to the UniFi Controller. Select the switch and navigate to Ports → Port Management. S...
