Materials: Use durable, machine-generated labels resistant to fading, moisture, heat, and abrasion. Heat shrink tubing labels are commonly used for fiber optic applications.

Smart Labeling: RFID, NFC, and digital tracking technologies can enhance maintenance efficiency and reduce downtime.
