Replace Pre-Terminated Patch Cords: If the damage is limited to a short jumper cable connecting to the ONT, you can safely replace it with a matching SC or LC connector type. Splicing the Cable: For a cut or broken cable, you can attempt a mechanical splice using a fiber optic repair kit: Cut away the damaged section. Strip the outer jacket and buffer to expose the fiber core. Clean the fiber ends with alcohol pads. Align the fibers in a mechanical splice sleeve or use a fusion splicer if available. Inspect the cleaved ends under a microscope to ensure proper alignment and minimal signal loss. Testing: After repair, test the connection for signal integrity and performance. A Visual Fault Locator (VFL) or OTDR can confirm that the light path is restored.
