4. **Attach the Conductor to the Cable Armor** Secure the bonding conductor to the exposed armor using a listed clamp, lug, or connector. After installation, wrap the connection with vinyl tape to protect against sharp edges and prevent accidental contact.
5. **Connect to the Building Ground** Bond the other end of the conductor to the intersystem bonding termination or another accessible grounding point that connects to the building's grounding electrode system. This ensures the metallic components are safely tied to earth ground, dissipating static charges and protecting against electrical transients.
6. **Verify Compliance** Ensure the installation complies with NEC Article 770.100, ANSI/TIA-568-C.0, and ANSI/TIA/EIA-J-STD-607 standards. Local codes may have add...
