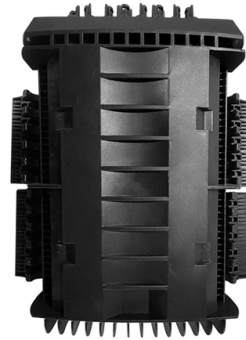

Fusion or Mechanical Splicing: Fusion splicing welds the fiber ends together, providing very low insertion loss and high long-term reliability. Mechanical splicing aligns fibers using a mechanical device, allowing faster installation without specialized equipment. Splice Tray Organization: Spliced fibers are placed in splice trays inside the box, which protect the fibers and manage excess lengths. Trays are stackable and often secured with a spring or wire mechanism. Connector Termination: The pigtail ends are terminated with connectors (e.g., LC, SC, ST) to interface with network equipment or patch panels. Types of Terminal Boxes Wall-Mounted FTBs: Compact, suitable for residential or small-scale installations. Rack-Mounted FTBs: Designed for data centers or larger networks, providing scalability. Outdoor FTBs: Weatherproof boxes for external installations. Straight-Through or Branched Boxes: Depending on the number of input and output fibers, e.g., 2 in/8 out, 4 in/24 out.
