High-speed applications: SFP+ or higher modules are used for 10 Gbps or faster links, and the fiber type must match the transceiver specifications.

Patch Cord Lengths: Include a safety buffer of 10-20% beyond measured distances to account for routing, slack, and future adjustments.

Redundancy: High-availability networks may require backup links, effectively doubling the number of patch cords.

Spare Fibers: Reserve extra strands for future growth or potential breaks, especially in multi-fiber cables.

Indoor vs Outdoor: Outdoor-rated fiber is necessary for external runs, particularly in conduits exposed to moisture or temperature variations.
