

Fire protection cables can only be used in trough-type cable trays



Overview

Due to their exposure to the open air because of the cable trays, the wires contained within need a very durable outer covering. The regulations dictate that the cables must either be Type TC (also known as Tray Rated) or must be metal-armored (Type MC). Type TC – Tray Cable – (NEC Article 336) –Power and control tray cable type TC is a factory assembly of two or more insulated conductors, with or without associated bare or covered grounding conductors, under a non-metallic jacket. TC cables are rated for 600 volts and can be used in industrial. Cable Trays have been permitted in the hazardous (classified) locations in the National Electrical Code for Class I (flammable vapor and gases) since the 1978 NEC and have been used extensively in chemical plants, refineries, and other types of facilities. This is a description of how to select, install, and support these metal or plastic frames, on which electrical wires are installed. You should consider it as a series of instructions that make the buildings resistant to. Grounding: Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors (EGC) if they meet NEC requirements. The use and installation of cable trays is covered by legally enforceable OSHA regulations in 29 CFR 1910.
