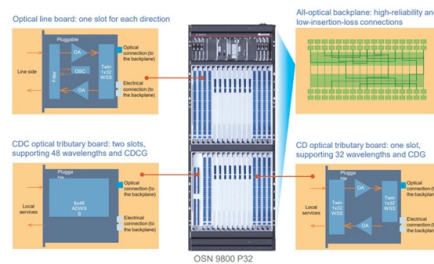


Hole for cable trays in walls
