Safety Considerations**Proper Sizing:** Jumpers must be rated for the current they carry to prevent overheating or fire hazards.

Material Compatibility: Using copper jumpers with aluminum supply wires can cause galvanic corrosion over time, so proper connectors or anti-oxidation compounds are recommended.

Avoid Improper Phasing: Incorrectly connecting jumpers between phases can create dangerous conditions, including overloading the neutral or causing voltage imbalances.

Compliance with Standards: Installation should follow local electrical codes and standards, such as using appropriately rated MCBs, RCCBs, and ensuring proper earthing.
