

How to erect fiber optic cables on poles

All-Dielectric Self-Supporting (ADSS) cables are suitable near power lines and allow for pole sharing, reducing costs. Carefully unroll the cable to avoid kinks or damage.

Stringing and Installation Cables can be installed using stationary or moving reel methods. Temporary supports or chutes are placed at each pole, and a pull line is threaded through these supports and attached to the cable. Use a winch or non-metallic rope to pull the cable, monitoring tension to avoid exceeding the maximum rated cable load (MRCL). Proper sag must be maintained to prevent stress on the fiber.

Splicing, Termination, and Testing At designated points, splice the fiber using fusion splicing for minimal signal loss. Terminate cables at junction boxes or dead-end poles. Test the network with an OTDR to check for signal loss or faults, ensuring the installation meets performance standards.
