Secure and Bundle Cables Use Velcro straps, zip ties, or P-clips to secure pigtail bundles without over-tightening, which can damage fibers. Releasable ties allow adjustments and maintenance while keeping the cables organized. Additional Tips Keep pigtail lengths short but sufficient for maintenance access.
