

How to power on a secondary distribution box

- 4. Connect to the Main Panel** Install a dedicated breaker in the main panel to feed the subpanel. Connect the two hot wires to this breaker, the neutral wire to the main neutral bus, and the ground wire to the main ground bus .
- 5. Wiring the Subpanel** Connect the incoming hot wires to the subpanel's main lugs or main breaker. Connect the neutral wire to the subpanel's neutral bus. Connect the ground wire to the subpanel's ground bus. Ensure that the neutral and ground buses are separated in the subpanel to prevent neutral current from flowing through the grounding system .
- 6. Install Circuit Breakers and Outgoing Circuits** Position the branch circuit breakers in the subpanel and connect each circuit wire to its corresponding breaker. Label each circuit clearly for safety and future maintenance .
- 7. Inspection and Testing** After wiring, use a multimeter to verify all connections, ch...
