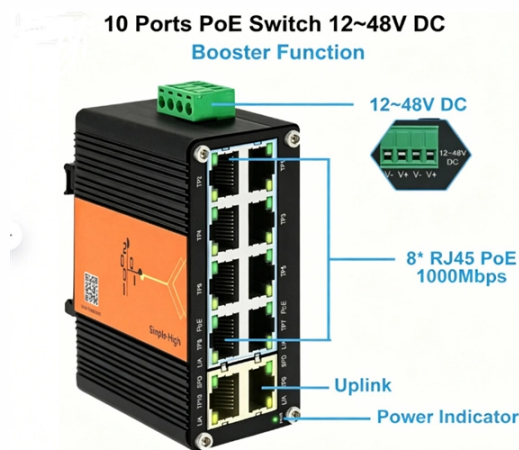

- 5. Equipment and Module Failures:** Faulty transceivers, switches, routers, or unstable power supplies can cause intermittent outages, even if the fiber itself is intact.
- 6. Contamination:** Dust, oil, or fingerprints on connectors reduce signal quality and can mimic cable faults.

Prevention Strategies

- 1. Proper Installation and Handling:** Follow manufacturer bend-radius guidelines, use bend-insensitive fibers in tight spaces, and employ cable management hardware like radius limiters and slack storage units.
- 2. Protective Measures:** Use armored or industrial-grade cables in high-risk areas, seal splices in enclosures with desiccants, and clearly mark cable pathways to prevent accidental damage.
