Buffer coating diameter (e.g., 250 μ m) and overall cable diameter (e.g., 0.89IN) are also included for splicing and handling purposes.
- Distance Markings** Some cables have distance markers along the jacket, e.g., "00030 FEET," updated every few feet, to track how much cable has been deployed or remains on the reel.
