

How to run fiber optic cables on site

Decide between armored or dielectric cables depending on environmental exposure, and select conduits, innerducts, or tray systems to protect the fiber.

Installation Methods Fiber optic cables can be installed using several methods:

- Underground installation:** Trenching or directional drilling to place micro-ducts or conduits, minimizing environmental disruption.
- Aerial installation:** Mounting cables on utility poles or existing structures.
- Cable pulling or blowing:** Techniques to feed fiber through conduits while monitoring tension to prevent damage. Maintain the minimum bend radius and avoid excessive pulling tension to prevent signal degradation.

Termination and Splicing Once the cable is in place, perform termination and splicing using fusion splicers or mechanical connectors. Proper handling is critical because fiber strands are thinner than a human hair, and small bends or contamination can reduce performance. Use fiber distribution points or nodes to split signals for multiple endpoints, especially in FTTH (Fiber to the Home) or FTTP (Fiber to the Premises) de...
