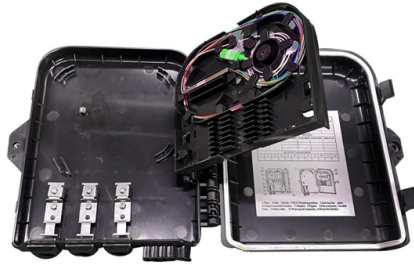


How to use a modular fill light
