Who is a Good Candidate? Candidates for a mandibular bridge should have healthy adjacent teeth that can support the bridge. It is often recommended for individuals who:

- Need a temporary solution for a missing tooth.
- Are not suitable candidates for dental implants due to bone density issues or other factors.
- Prefer a non-invasive procedure that does not require anesthesia.
