- Overcurrent Protection:** Each panel must have breakers or fuses rated for its load. The main feeder should also have a breaker to protect the entire system.
- Grounding and Bonding:** Proper earthing is essential for safety and system stability.
- Code Compliance:** Follow NEC or local electrical codes for conductor sizing, panel ratings, and tap rules.
