Preparing for Future Fiber Installation Once fiber becomes available, installation typically involves:

- Running a fiber drop from the neighborhood network to your property.
- Installing a Network Interface Device (NID) outside your home.
- Connecting the fiber to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) inside, which converts light signals into data for your devices.
- Linking the ONT to your router or gateway for full internet access.

Professional installation usually takes 2–6 hours for residential setups, though larger or commercial buildings may require more time.
