Optical Line Terminal (OLT) An Optical Line Terminal (OLT) is a network device located at the service provider's central office or data center. It acts as the “brain” of a Passive Optical Network (PON), converting standard Ethernet/IP signals into optical signals for transmission over fiber optics, managing bandwidth, and coordinating communication with multiple ONUs or ONTs at the subscriber end (Network-Side) .

- Data Transmission and Distribution:** Sends downstream data (internet, voice, video) to multiple ONUs and receives upstream data from them .
- Dynamic Bandwidth Allocation (DBA):** Optimizes bandwidth usage among connected users to handle bursty traffic efficiently .
- Signal Conversion:** Converts electrical signals from the provider's backbone into optical signals suitable for fiber transmission .
- Network Management:** Monitors performance, manages subscriber connections, and ensures security and fault detection .

OLT devices can vary in form factor and capacity:

- Box OLTs:** Compact, suitable for small-scale networks, typically with 2–16 PON ports .
- Rack-Mounted OLTs:** Modular, scalable, and suitable for large deployments, supporting dozens of PON ports and thousands of ONUs .

Optical Network Unit (ONU) / Optical Network Terminal (ONT) An Optical Network Unit (ONU) or Optical Network Terminal (ONT) is the endpoint device located at the subscriber's premises. It converts optical signals received from the OLT into electrical signals for use by customer devices, such as computers, phones, or TVs .
