From the box, optical fibers are routed "out" to subscriber endpoints or other network nodes via pigtails or patch cables. The number of output ports varies, commonly ranging from 1 to 24 cores, depending on network requirements. The box ensures that fibers are organized, protected, and easily accessible for maintenance or network expansion.

Differences from Termination Boxes While a termination box is usually smaller and located at the customer premises for connecting a single subscriber line, a distribution box serves as an intermediate node, handling multiple fibers and distributing them to several endpoints. The distribution box is designed for higher capacity and outdoor or shared-space deployment, whereas termination boxes are compact and indoor-focused.
