

Safety Precautions for Level 3 Distribution Boxes

Key Safety Precautions

- 1. The leakage protector should be selected according to the environment: for wet locations, the rated leakage current should not exceed 15 mA, with a response time under 0.1 seconds.
- 3. Dedicated Switches and Circuit Separation** Every electrical appliance connected to a Level 3 box should have its own dedicated switch. The principle of "one machine, one switch, one leakage, one box, one lock" must be followed, preventing a single switch from controlling multiple devices. Power and lighting circuits should be separated, even if housed in the same box, to reduce the risk of overload and simplify troubleshooting.
- 4. Load and Equipment Marking** All switches and circuit breakers inside the Level 3 box should be clearly labeled with their purpose, and the box itself should be numbered according to the site's distribution plan. This ensures quick identification during maintenance or emergency.
