Solid State Power Controllers (SSPCs), which are modular semiconductor switches that allow precise control of electrical loads and integrate smart metering and monitoring functions. CAN-Bus or other communication interfaces for remote configuration and monitoring, particularly in advanced applications like aircraft systems. Enclosures designed for safety and environmental protection, including rainproof tops and inner/outer door designs for outdoor or industrial use.

Applications SPDBs are widely used in: Residential and commercial buildings, where they distribute three-phase power from a transformer to multiple units or floors. Industrial facilities, supporting heavy machinery, lighting, and control circuits. Aviation and connected aircraft systems, where SPDBs integrate with avionics and sensors, enabling in-flight monitoring and data collection while reducing wiring complexity and electromagnetic interference.
