

Service distance of distribution box

- Overall distance for secondary distribution boxes: generally up to 30 meters from the main distribution point.
- Installation height: often around 1.5 meters above ground for accessibility and safety.

Other considerations include load capacity, IP/NEMA protection ratings, material durability, and compliance with local electrical codes. Proper spacing ensures safe operation, prevents overloading, and allows for maintenance and future upgrades.
