Ceiling and ducting: Use micro-perforated ceilings or ducting to evenly distribute cold air and prevent recirculation of hot air into the cold aisle. Installation Guidelines for Desktop-Type Equipment Positioning: Place desktop-type servers or small cabinets so that their front intakes face the cold aisle. Cable management: Route network and power cables through side cabinets or overhead bridges to avoid blocking airflow. Containment barriers: Install doors or panels at aisle ends and overhead to fully enclose the cold aisle, reducing temperature gradients and improving energy efficiency.
