

# Spare Internal Network Core Switch



## AI Overview

A spare internal network core switch should be fully pre-configured, compatible with your existing network, and ready for rapid deployment to minimize downtime. Key Considerations for a Spare Core Switch

1. Pre-Configuration and Compatibility Before deployment, configure the spare switch offline with all necessary VLANs, SVIs, routing protocols, ACLs, and management IPs. Ensure the switch model supports the same Layer 2/Layer 3 features as the current core, including link aggregation, QoS, and high-speed uplinks. This reduces the risk of IP conflicts and ensures seamless integration during cutover.
2. Physical Deployment and Cabling Position the spare switch near the existing core switch with available ports and optics. Pre-connect cables in a down state if possible, so that during a maintenance window, only minimal physical moves are required. Document all port mappings and uplinks to avoid confusion during migration.
3. Migration Strategy

**SVI Cutover Method:** Configure the spare switch with the same SVI IP addresses in shutdown mode. During the maintenance window, shut down the SVI on the old core, bring up the SVI on the spare, and migrate connections VLAN by VLAN. This approach minimizes downtime and avoids IP conflicts.

**Stepwise Cable Migration:** Move connections one at a time while monitoring network stability. This is safer for large networks with multiple VLANs and critical services.

**Routing and Gateway Considerations:** Ensure any HSRP, VRRP, or routing protocol adjacencies are pre-configured and tested to prevent routing loops or outages.- 4. Testing and Rollback Simulate the migration in a lab environment if possible, including VLANs, ACLs, and routing. Prepare a rollback plan in case services fail after cutover. Verify connectivity to firewalls, servers, and upstream routers before finalizing the switch replacement.
- 5. Documentation and Review Maintain detailed documentation of configurations, port mappings, and migration steps. Multiple reviews reduce errors and shorten the maintenance window.
