International and Regional Standards

ITU and IEEE: Recommend 0.6 meters minimum in urban areas and 1.0 meters in rural or agricultural zones to protect against frost, plows, and erosion.

ETSI (Europe): Suggests 0.8–1.0 meters, with 0.5 meters allowed in urban ducts.

Asia (China, India): Rural zones require 1.0–1.5 meters, while urban areas are 0.6–0.9 meters.

Special Considerations

Frost Lines: In cold climates, cables should be buried below the frost line (often 36 inches or more) to prevent frost heave.

Road Crossings: Depths of 1.2–1.5 meters with concrete encasement are recommended to withstand traffic loa...
