Overview of Switch Aggregation Switch aggregation, also known as link aggregation or port channeling, allows multiple physical Ethernet interfaces to be combined into a single logical interface, called a Link Aggregation Group (LAG) or aggregated Ethernet (AE) interface. This provides higher bandwidth, redundancy, and load balancing across member links, ensuring traffic continues to flow even if one link fails. Configuration Methods 1. Static Aggregation Definition: Physical ports are manually bound to a logical port without negotiation. Requirements: All member ports must have the same speed, duplex mode, and VLAN configuration. The link must be up before aggregation. Advantages: Simple to configure and does not rely on protocol negotiation. Limitations: No automatic detection of link failures or misconfigurations; manual intervention is required if a port fails. 2. Dynamic Aggregation (LACP) Definition: Uses the Link Aggregation Control Protocol (LACP), part of the IEEE 802.3ad standard, to automatically negotiate and manage the aggregation of multiple links. Features: Automatic detection of compatible ports. Load balancing across member links. Failover support if a member link fails. Requirements: All member interfaces must be in full-duplex mode and have compatible speeds. LACP assigns unique IDs and priorities to each interface for proper distribution. Advantages: Provides redundancy and automatic failover, reducing manual configuration errors. Best Practices Ensure all aggregated ports have identical speed and duplex settings. Verify VLAN consistency across all member ports. Use LACP for critical links to enable automatic failover and load balancing. For multi-vendor environments, confirm protocol compatibility and supported features. Monitor traffic distribution to ensure...
