Cable management boxes can also hide power strips and cords effectively.

Safety and Compliance

Even when wires are hidden, NEC Article 392 requires that cable trays maintain proper support, spacing, and fill limits. Wires must be secured at intervals and rated for exposure in trays. Covers are optional but recommended in high-traffic areas or outdoor installations to protect cables from physical damage or sunlight.

Key Considerations

- Ensure the tray type matches the environment and cable type.
- Maintain accessibility for inspection and maintenance.
- Use covers or solid trays where protection or concealment is necessary.
