A three-level distribution system consists of a main distribution box, a secondary distribution box, and a tertiary switch box, each serving a distinct role in safely distributing and controlling electrical power.

Structure and Function

First-Level Distribution Box (Main Distribution Box): This is the primary hub of the power system, usually installed near the power source. It receives electrical energy and distributes it to secondary distribution boxes. Key components include the main circuit breaker, main leakage protector, voltmeter, and ammeter. It provides centralized management and monitoring of the entire site's power supply, ensuring safety and reliability.

Second-Level Distribution Box (Sub-Distribution Box): Installed near power consumption areas or large equipment, it receives power from the first-level box and distributes it to tertiary switch boxes. It typically contains branch circuit breakers and branch leakage protectors, protecting and managing each branch circuit. This level ensures that faults in one branch do not affect the entire system.

Third-Level Distribution Box (Switch Box): This is the final junction box directly connected to electrical equipment. Each switch box generally controls one piece of equipment or a group of similar devices, following the "one machine, one switch" principle. It contains isolation switches, circuit breakers, and leakage protectors to provide direct control and protection for the connected equipment.

Safety and Installation Principles

Two-Level Protection: Leakage protection should be installed both in the main distribution box and in the tertiary switch box to prevent electrical hazards.

No Cross-Level Wiring: Electrical equipment must not bypass any distribution level; each level must be connected hierarchically.

Separate Circuits: Power and lighting circuits should be separated, with dedicated distribution boards and switch boxes for each
