

Trapezoidal cable tray passing through the wall



AI Overview

When a trapezoidal cable tray passes through a wall, it must be properly sealed with fire-rated materials and protected to prevent heat transfer and maintain fire safety.

Firestopping and Sealing When routing a trapezoidal cable tray through a wall, the opening must be sealed with fire-rated penetration materials to prevent fire and smoke spread. Use firestop packs, firestop mastic, or fire-resistant mineral wool to fill gaps around the tray, ensuring no visible cracks or voids remain. For large openings, a fire-resistant backing plate should be installed before sealing. The gap between the tray and firestop material should not exceed 1 cm^2 , and the packing thickness should be at least 24 cm. Cover plates should be square, evenly painted, and securely fixed to close the opening.

Fire-Rated Wall Considerations Trapezoidal cable trays should not pass through fire-rated walls without protection, as the metal tray can conduct heat and ignite materials on the other side. If penetration is necessary, the tray must be coated with an intumescent or fire-resistant coating for a sufficient distance on both sides of the wall. This ensures compliance with fire safety regulations and maintains the wall's fire rating.

Heat Dissipation and Tray Integrity To prevent overheating, maintain adequate clearance between cables and consider using perforated or wire mesh trays to improve airflow. Ensure the tray is not damaged or corroded, and inspect connections for alignment, grounding continuity, and mechanical integrity. Avoid modifying the tray coating or structure during installation.

Compliance with Standards Cable tray penetrations should comply with European Standard EN 1366-3 for fire testing and classification according to EN 13501-2. The penetration system must be selected based on the type and configuration of cables, ensuring that the fire resistance rating is maintained for the specific cable group.
