Custom or Manufacturer-Specific Fittings: Some software or installation scenarios may require custom families or manufacturer-specific BIM content to model the connection accurately. In real installations, a combination of horizontal runs, vertical risers, and elbows can replicate a tee connection if a pre-made tee is unavailable.

Installation Considerations

Secure Mounting: Vertical trays must be anchored to walls or structural supports at regular intervals to handle the cable weight.

Load Capacity: Ensure the tray and fittings can support the total cable load plus a safety margin for future expansion.

Fire Stopping: When penetrating floors or ceilings, fire-stop systems are required to prevent the spread of fire and smoke.
