- Warnings about shock or arc flash hazards
- Instructions for safe operation or maintenance
- PPE requirements and incident energy levels where applicable

Durability and Permanence: Labels must adhere to surfaces and remain legible under construction conditions. Standards such as ANSI/UL 969 and CSA C22.2 No. 0.15 define permanence requirements for safety-related markings, ensuring they resist abrasion, moisture, and environmental exposure.
