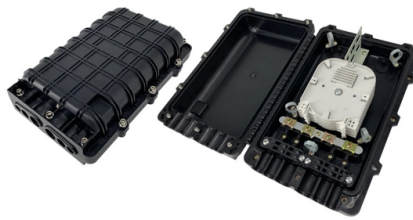


Where is the fiber optic connector located in the router
